Personnel

1. To increase membership by 25 new members

Focus: Rule 36 Position of players

36.1 In relation to the rink of play

1 Players at the mat end of the rink who are not delivering a bowls should stand at least 1 meter behind the mat.

2 Players at the head end of the rink who are not controlling play should stand

-behind the jack and away from the head;

- on the surrounds of the green if the jack is in the ditch;

-or well clear of the head if it is not possible to stand on the surrounds.

36.2 In relation to a neighboring rink

1 A player should not go into a neighboring rink where play is in progress

2 A player should neither go into or walk along a neighboring rink, even if it is not being used, while an opponent is about to deliver or is actually delivering a bowl

If you are physically able, please stand up on the surround; if not, stand at least 1 meter behind and out of the peripheral vision of the player on the mat. Do not begin to change

ends until all play has been completed; then walk close to the center of your rink with minimum delay.

Note from Palo Alto LBC Coach's Corner: In triples, only the two vices should be standing behind the head. The leads should be at the back of the green, preferably on the surround. When skip A is on the mat, then the vice for team A should be in the head to communicate with the skip. Once the skip's bowl comes to rest, skip B takes over the mat and vice B takes over the head.

Only one vice should actually be in the head at any given time until the end is completed. Then both will agree the score - after measuring if necessary. Normally the team conceding the end would do the measuring. In a pairs game the same rules apply only it is the leads alternating in the head.
